1. Welcome & Approval of Minutes for Oct, 2021

Call to Order at 7:05 PM. Minutes Approved by Lynn and seconded by Stephanie.

2. Principal's Report (Rachelle Sintic)

Rachelle spoke of the destreamed math pilot that was underway at the school, on which Vice-Principal Greg Wsynsyksi was implicated in. Two classrooms have been outfitted with whiteboards and a class set of chromebooks. The music teacher, Heather Holmes, is setting up a virtual music club which is well on its way to be set up for next semester. Preparation is underway for the literacy tests. Homework club is up and running. Parent-teacher interviews will be held on November 29th. A reminder that this Friday is a PD Day.

3. Teacher Report (Derwyn Mok for Beverly Melmyick)

Cross-Country was up and running with Marieve Fontaine, and students had taken part in a 10k. The Boys Senior Volleyball team won semi-finals. Student Chat on Thursdays is underway with a focus on student wellness. An Instagram page has been started for Jobs for students. From October 27th until December 7th, there is a promo for 34% off of Tremblant tickets, instead of \$120 they are \$78. A portion of sales go to support Mr. Smith's Outdoor Ed program. The promo code was then shared in the Zoom chat.

4. Guest Teacher Report (Derwyn Mok)

Mr. Mok gave an update on initiatives from the Business Department. Mr. Collins has written three social justice books, and they are for sale for \$5 each, \$2 will go back to Mr. Collins and \$3 will go towards supporting small businesses. It is hoped that enough will be sold to provide ten small businesses with \$100 each. These are small, local businesses that have supported the school community in the past.

5. . Student Council Representative (Desmond Anuku)

The Student Council representative, Desmond Anuku, provided an update on school activities, including the activities that had taken place as part of Halloween Fest. There will also be a Spirit Week taking place from November 22-26.

6. Chair's Report (Cindy Jadayel & Nancy Deans)

The Ottawa Public Library -Greenboro Branch is currently looking for newcomer volunteers for our Newcomer Advisory Group. If any of you know someone that may be interested, please

share this information, Jocelyn Preece asked Cindy to pass it along. This is an opportunity for newcomers to learn about the library, give their feedback on library programs and services, and practice their English. They meet twice a month on Wednesday afternoons 1:30-3pm. (very beneficial as they have given many employment references for previous group members and it is a small commitment position).

7. OCASC Report (Nancy D)

Last meeting occurred on Oct 21, the next meeting is next week Nov. 18th. Other secondary schools are concerned with course cancellations and decrease in sections. Equity in courses due to enrolment is a concern. Some students are not getting all the credits or courses they need to graduate in rural areas and the Arts in particular has taken a big hit and is impacting all students with so many courses cancelled.

Also that OCASC formed a sub-committee to look at parent involvement in committees across the board to advocate for more parent voice where decisions are made.

There were a number of delegations at the "Committee Of the Whole" meeting last month asking for faster return to arts programs and extra-curricular programs now that others are starting up (like Sports)

Canterbury HS brought concerns over cancellation of an important Dance program course, looking for reinstatement of course. Larger concern for all arts is that with less courses offered in the arts, the less interest in returning, which means lower enrolment and more cancelations.

Need to keep the bigger picture of arts for students not only as pathways, but for greater well-being.

Most recent update is that wind instruments are allowed indoors, but only as part of a music class, not band or extra-credit, as these add another cohort and this is not acceptable at this time
