Ron Duprey - CO-OP

COOP at Ridgemont has been successful and provides students with great learning experiences. He focuses on students strengths and interests and works at placing students in locations where they can gain experience. Students can earn up to 4 credits and some areas there is Dual Credit system, where they can can credits that count for first year courses at a secondary school, like Algonquin. Shared many examples of students thriving.

He has seen three reasons why students take COOP -

- 1. Entry level experience those who have never had a job can learn what it's like. They can understand the responsibilities and also gain confidence. This confidence also spills over in other areas of their life and is so wonderful to see
- 2. Students looking to explore what is out there
- 3. Those who know where they want to work and can get more experience, knowledge, contacts in their fields and help them make future decisions as to their next career path

Placements are always being explored and there is a challenge in connecting with businesses, organisations etc for placements.
